During this time, our Leaders of Change embarked on a path characterized by decisive actions and transformative results, surpassing previous expectations and establishing new standards for environmental responsibility.

Here's a rundown of the of the Leaders of Change progress milestones we have contributed to:

### **Leaders of Change Journey in Numbers**



You obtained over 5512data points which will help us make scientific contributions and realisations.



You undertook 27events and participated in 2,308.5 hours to protecting nature across on the ground, train and ideate events.



You collected 747.5 kg of waste which will help us protect our ecosystems.







### You've collected an impressive 5512 data points across World Environment Day and Other Events - 65.4% from the annual goal!

This quarter, we gathered a wealth of data from **World Environment Day and other events**, highlighting our ongoing commitment to environmental stewardship inspired by the late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan. His **legacy of dedication to preserving our natural heritage guides our mission as Leaders of Change**, underscoring our responsibility to protect the environment for future generations.

Our recent research efforts have played a **crucial role in shaping government policies and enhancing environmental advocacy**. By collecting data across diverse landscapes—from the wadis of Fujairah to the mangroves of Umm al Quwain and Abu Dhabi—you have acted as citizen scientists, capturing footage, recording wildlife observations, and contributing to biodiversity assessments. These **insights are vital for informing National Plans of Action and suporting IUCN red listing initiatives**.



The data amassed from these efforts conducted across various terrains including the wadis of Fujairah, the sites of Bithnah, Masfout, and the mangroves of Umm al Quwain and Abu Dhabi informs the National Plans of Action for species conservation and bolsters the IUCN red listing initiatives, reinforcing our commitment to preserving biodiversity. As you complete another guarter of 2024 with the Leaders of Change programme, we take pride in reporting the collection of over 19,612 research observations and the analysis of more than 2,404 kg of litter.



### World Environment Day: A Celebration of Nocturnal Life

This year's World Environment Day, themed "Our Land. Our Future," focused on landrestoration, desertification, and drought resilience.

On this occasion, you gathered with your fellow Leaders of Change members and volunteers to learn about the **rich nocturnal wildlife that thrives under the night sky**. Our conservation experts led the group through the Wadi Wurayah national park, and explained how the wider community can help gather valuable data on plant and animals species, and support ongoing research as citizen scientists. All **46 of you documented a range of nocturnal creatures** and contributed over **138 hours of community effort**.

Nature at Night serves as a cornerstone of our awareness-raising efforts and **supports in protecting 30% of the UAE's wild areas by 2030**. By expanding our exploration into various nocturnal habitats, we aim to foster a deeper appreciation for the misunderstood creatures that inhabit our homeland. Through such initiatives, we not only strive to achieve our conservation goals but also seek to transform attitudes and behaviours towards bats, scorpions, and geckos, fostering harmony between humans and nature.



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
### **Member Highlights:**

# We are over **37%** of the way towards our goal of contributing 15,000 hours for nature.

Our Leaders of Change have collectively dedicated 2,380.5 hours across 27 riveting events across the three pillars of our program: TRAIN, IDEATE, and ACT.


In the **TRAIN** phase, you and your peers have invested **428 hours** in a range of enriching seminars. These sessions covered essential topics such as 'Bat Chats,' regional biodiversity, climate issues, corporate climate action, and eco-footprint measurement. This training has **equipped you with the skills needed to become effective citizen scientists**, allowing you to make meaningful contributions to our local ecosystems.

During the IDEATE phase, you engaged in 193.5 hours of stimulating discussions and collaborative workshops that explored how climate change shapes our actions. These sessions **deepened** your understanding of the cause-and-effect relationships within climate change, fostering innovative thinking and problem-solving.



In the ACT phase, you have committed 1,789 hours to hands-on conservation efforts. You played a crucial role in flood restoration projects in Al Bithnah, Fujairah, and Wadi Shees, Sharjah. By working with our scientific team, you contributed to restoring resilience in Masfout through the rehabilitation of farmlands and nature trails.

Your dedication and tireless efforts exemplify a profound commitment to environmental conservation and sustainable development, showcasing the impactful change our community is driving.





### You collected 747.5 kg of waste extensive flood restoration activities and other on-the-ground efforts around the UAE!

In the second quarter of the year, through hard work and determination we can report the **collection of 747.5 kg of waste**. This vital contribution directly shapes national policies on single-use plastics, land utilization, and conservation legislation. Our success reflects the extensive efforts undertaken across various Emirates of the UAE.

In response to recent extreme weather events, the Leaders of Change program had intensified its focus on flood recovery and resilience, by implementing biological and engineering measures to mitigate community losses, such as introducing drought-resistant crops and constructing reinforced retaining walls to protect falaj systems and farms from future flash floods.

We were excited to see **205 Leaders of Change and volunteers from across the UAE come together** with conservation experts in Al Bithnah (Fujairah), Wadi Shees (Sharjah),



and Masfout (Ajman). Collectively, **you removed 165.5 kg of debris, repaired 550 meters of falaj irrigation canals, and restored 300 meters of nature trails**. This teamwork ensured a steady flow of fresh water to farmlands and revitalized essential natural habitats.

Heartfelt gratitude to all of you who braved the early hours in Fujairah, Sharjah and Ajman to address the damage from recent floods. Your efforts not only comprised of clearing debris, repairing irrigation channels, and but **also restoring 30 Arabian Moringa trees, along with planting 55 new saplings**. Your dedication is helping these affected areas **recover and build resilience against future extreme weather events**.

By actively participating in these clean-up and conservation efforts, our members are not only enhancing the health and resilience of our ecosystems but also providing vital support to the wildlife and communities that depend on them.

Hanan Yousef commented: "We are part of a beautiful community, and despite the storm, it's good that we can come together to do this effort. Even if it's a small part we are playing, we can slowly restore it part by part. also It's good that we are able to give back to the community."

Together, let's continue to nurture the seeds of transformation for a brighter, greener future.




